These are our schools top 10 books. Why not join the library in town and see if you can find them there, or check out youtube (parent supervision required), to see if someone else is reading these stories.




Each class has their own cosy reading area where children can share their love of reading. We hope you enjoy reading at home with your child too.

Attendance

Going to school regularly is important for your child's future. For example, children who miss school often can fall behind with their work and do less well in exams.

Arranging appointments and outings after school hours, at weekends or during school holidays will help to prevent disruption to your child's education and to the school. Under normal circumstances you should not expect the school to agree to your child going on holiday during term time.

Please ensure you phone the office every day if your child is not well enough to attend.

After school club and Breakfast club are services we provide to support all our families. Please enquire in the office if you would like to know more. In 2018-2019 it was a real hit with our children (we were unable to run our usual after school club in the last two years due to covid restrictions). A Safe and Caring School

All adults who work at the school are here to help and support our children and families. Some adults have particular roles and training which means they may be the best people to help you.

Mrs Natalija Ananeva - Sliaze, Mrs Kirby and Miss Rogers are our Designated Safeguarding leads. If you have any concerns over the safety and welfare of any children at Highgate then please speak to them.

Mrs Natalija Ananeva-Sliaze is our Parent Support Advisor

You can request a meeting with her to discuss any issues or concerns you may have.

We work with and promote the work of many agencies that can support children and families with health concerns, worries about behaviour and many other problems.

A display in our foyer contains information leaflets and numbers that families may find useful. Please take a look. You can speak to school staff or contact agencies directly if you feel they may be able to support you.

Our school is on a busy main road, road. To help us ensure the safety of all children please <u>always</u> shut the gates that lead into the playground. <u>Never</u> allow children, including older brothers and sisters, to climb on or over the fences around the school or between the gates. Children copy each other's behaviour, by allowing this you could be putting other children at risk.

Around 5,000 children under the age of 16 die or are seriously injured on Britain's roads each year

- Nearly two in three road accidents happen when children are walking or playing
- Almost two-thirds of child accident victims are boys

Unwanted Guests

Please remember to keep 'bug busting'. Nits and headlice are an ongoing concern for many parents. All children need to be checked regularly and treated when necessary to stop these little guys from spreading! Wet combing is an alternative to chemical treatment that costs very little but does need to be done consistently and regularly.
